

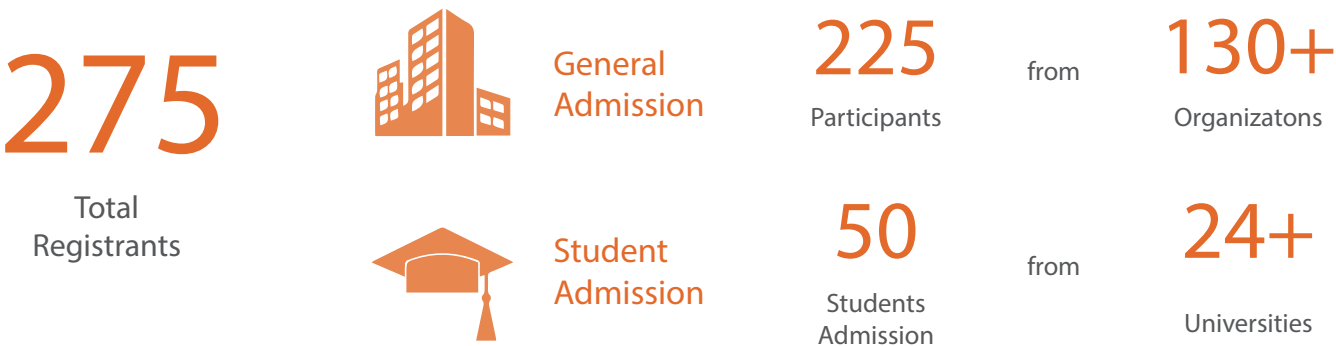

History

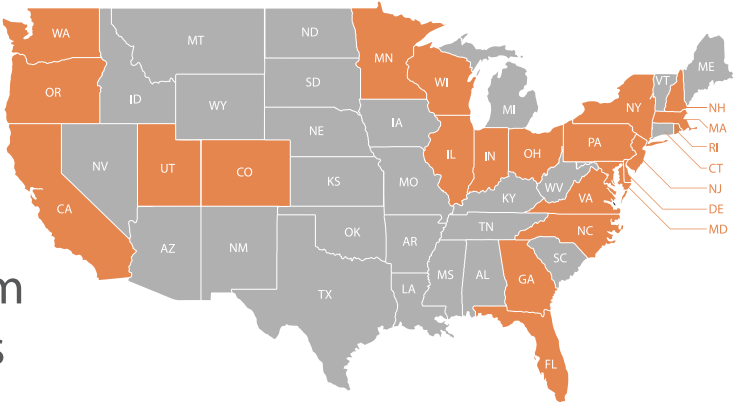
The first TransportationCamp was organized by OpenPlans in New York in March 2011, followed later that month in San Francisco. Since then, TransportationCamps have been organized in cities across North America. In 2014, OpenPlans handed the baton to Mobility Lab, which works with local committees of transportation professionals to organize TransportationCamps in cities across the country including Los Angeles, Houston, Washington, Atlanta, Boston, Denver, New York, and beginning in 2018, here in Philadelphia.
